### Mass killings are still rare

of all homicide victims annually



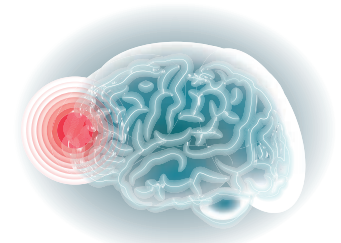
RARE EVENTS ARE ALSO KNOWN AS **BLACK SWANS**

# 12%

of mass killings are by public shootings. The majority are murders within families, gangs or robberies.

### The rate of mass shootings remains steady

according to the most recent data. In the U.S., 1,714 people were killed in 311 mass shootings since 2006.

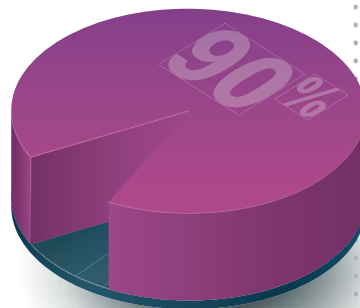


### Correlation: mass shootings and mental illness

A large body of research shows a statistical link between mass public killings and serious untreated psychiatric illness. The most commonly diagnosed illnesses among mass public shooters are paranoid schizophrenia and severe depression.

# 60%

of mass public shooters have been diagnosed with a mental disorder or have demonstrated serious mental illness prior to the attack.

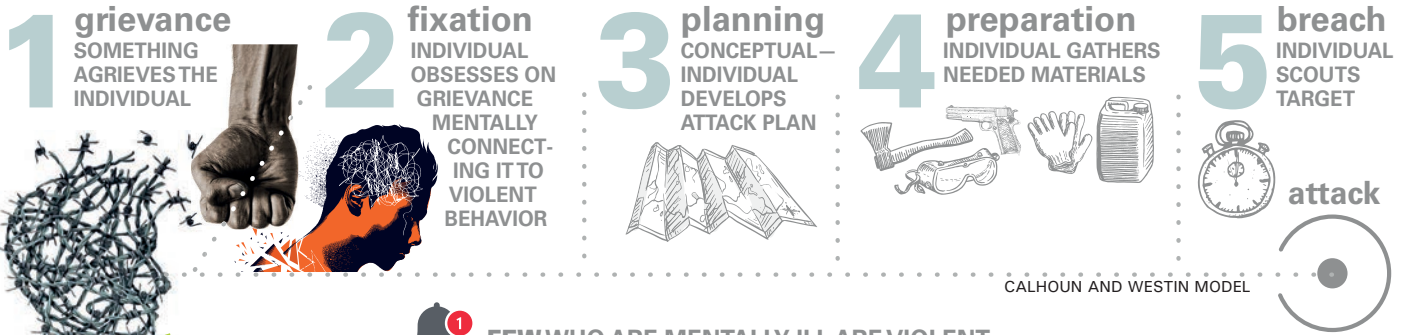


# over 90%

of public mass shootings take place in gun-free zones where civilians are not permitted to carry firearms

# SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

Before they commit their atrocities, mass shooters leave a trail of violent outbursts, threats and dark fixations.

### VIGILANCE

Develop situational awareness as context. What falls outside normal behavior?

### INTROSPECTION

Understand when changes to normal behavior may be occurring.

### ENGAGEMENT

Foster a functional mechanism that allows residents and staff to report events outside the range of normal.

### WILLINGNESS TO ACT

This is where the biggest gap occurs. When someone reports alarming behavior, you may be the person who gets the information to the proper authorities.

## Look for these signs. Before they act, most mass killers:

**81%**

tell someone about their plan to kill

**79%**

engage in threatening communications

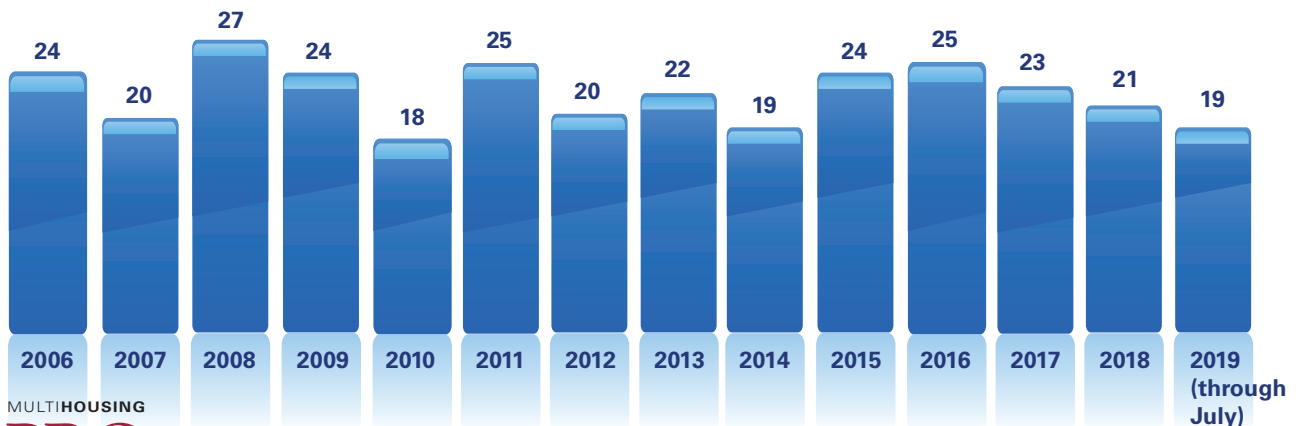
**75%**

engage in communications in the range of threatening

**most**

attackers have difficulty coping with significant loss and personal failure, they have considered or attempted suicide. The end game in an attack is they commit suicide or are killed.
